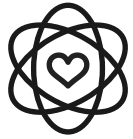

Celebrate Our Values Workshops:

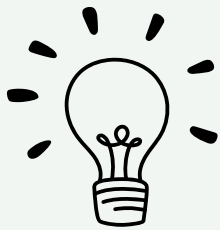
These workshops do a deeper dive into the core values of Messy Church: hospitality, all-ages, celebration, creativity, and Christ-centeredness.

Led by Ronda Bower

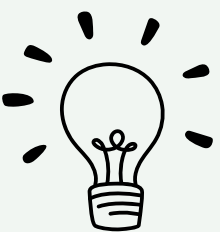

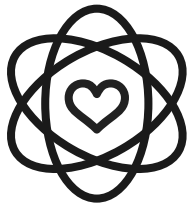


Prayer Stations at Messy Church

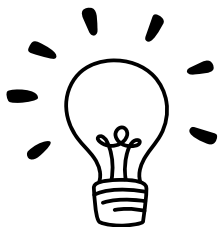
Equipping Your Messy Church for the Future

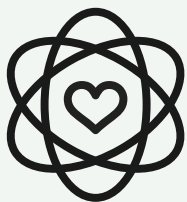
Unique Messy Church Themes

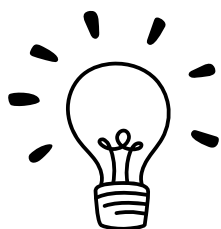
Messy Church IS Church!

Led by Johannah Myers

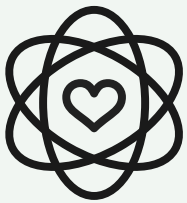

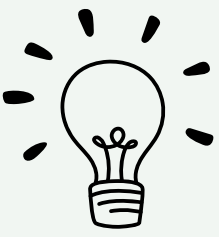

Led by Leyla Wagner and Marty Drake

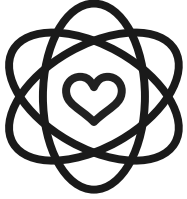

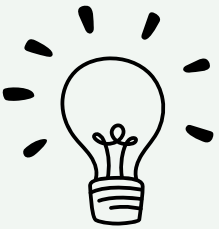

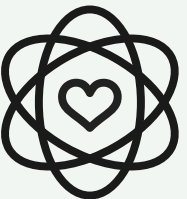
